



Call for Workshop Facilitators

The Safe Choices LGBT2SQ+ Support and Education Program is looking to contract **2-3 new workshop facilitators!** Safe Choices is funded by Vancouver Coastal Health's SMART Fund, and is a program of the Ending Violence Association of BC (EVA BC), a provincial non-profit organization that has existed in BC for over 25 years to serve as a resource for 240 community-based services supporting survivors of sexual violence, relationship violence, child abuse, and criminal harassment. The Safe Choices program focuses on preventing relationship violence in the LGBT2SQ+ community, and improving the health and safety of queer, trans, and non-binary folks.

As a Safe Choices workshop facilitator, you will co-facilitate workshops with folks on the coordination and facilitation team, build relationships with the LGBT2SQ+ community, and develop knowledge on relationship violence within our community. We deliver approximately 14 workshops each year within the Vancouver Coastal Health region. Contracted workshop facilitators will join our team and co-facilitate a combination of the following workshops:

Service Provider Workshops

for anti-violence, justice, social services, and healthcare workers on understanding the needs of LGBT2SQ+ folks experiencing relationship violence and providing inclusive services and support.

Healthy Relationship Workshops

for the LGBT2SQ+ community, focused on healthy communication, negotiating boundaries, sexuality and consent, relationship violence, and abuse.

'Healthy Relationships for Trans and Gender Diverse Folks, Their Partners, and Communities'

Workshops are scheduled based on the needs of agencies/groups receiving training and the availability of facilitators. All facilitators receive training/mentorship from the Program Coordinator, Assistant Program Coordinator, and experienced Safe Choices facilitators. Workshop facilitators will be compensated fairly for any workshops delivered.

We invite applications from folks with the following qualifications:

- 2 years of experience with teaching and/or group/workshop facilitation
- Understanding of trans and non-binary survivors' needs and LGBT2SQ+ services in BC
- Understanding of gender-based violence and anti-violence services in BC
- Intersectional analysis and anti-oppression approach to the work
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills

We strongly encourage QTBIPOC (Queer, Trans, Black, Indigenous, People of Colour), Two-Spirit, trans, and non-binary folks to apply. If you feel comfortable, please include your pronoun in your cover letter. Shortlisted candidates will be contacted in early September for an interview at EVA BC's office in Vancouver, located on the traditional unceded territory of the Coast Salish people.
